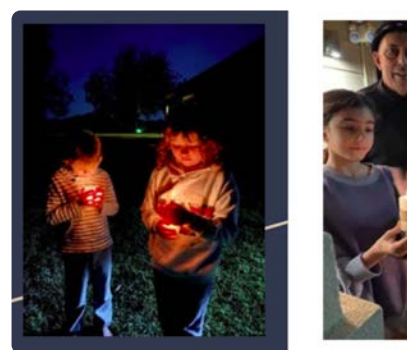

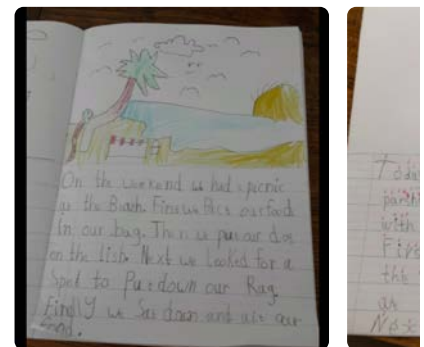
Learning and Teaching in the Juniors

The Year One students created beautiful pictures of their image of God. They could use paint, paper, craft or collage in their pictures.

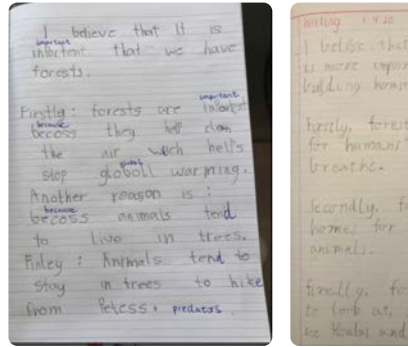


The students have also been learning to measure and compare the capacities of different objects. First, they had to estimate the container's capacity and use a measuring jug to measure the actual capacity of the containers.

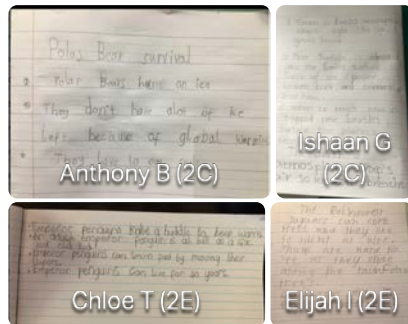


Year Two

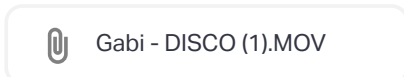


In reading, the students read books about global warming and animal habitats and wrote some interesting facts.
