On Friday 20th of November, all Galilee students competed in the annual swimming carnival. This year all students were driven by bus. The Year 6's left at 9:30 to MSAC and all the other students followed along a bit later. When we arrived through the gate, we were directed up to the stands by our teachers. We then all put down our bags and sat in our seats. It wasn't long before the sport captains were called down to help.

We went downstairs, and blew up some beach balls for the junior year level's activities. At this point, the Year 6 girls and boys had already done their freestyle race. Once the Year 2's arrived the sport captains got to help them in the pool. All of the Year 2's were extremely cooperative and loved cheering on their classmates in the water.

Next, we had our three Year 1 classes arrive. As there were a lot of them we had to have two Year 6's in every lane so we could support them. We kept reassuring the students that it doesn't matter if you win or lose, as long as you try.

Once all the Year 1's had done their first race of freestyle, they went again for their noodle race. This was when the students wrapped a noodle around them and they had to kick as fast as they could to reach the other end. The next race was the ball race, which is where there was a ball in the water and you had to hold it out in front with your head down, while kicking. When the last students went, we were done for the Year 1's.

All the other year levels such as the 3, 4, 5 and 6 students were doing an amazing job and swimming their hardest. The sport captains were cheering their classmates on from the other pool and were wishing everyone good luck. We had score updates during the day by Mr Martello, which everyone went silent to hear who was in 1st place.

Then we saw the Preps come in for their first ever swimming carnival. I could see all the excitement and nerves kick in as they walked around the pool. They went to get ready and next thing we know, they were all lining up with their bathers, swimming cap and goggles. We started off straight away with our freestyle race. All the Preps were trying their best and I could see that they were having a lot of fun. Then we had the noodle race which all the kids struggled with a bit but we got through it in the end. The ball race was a bit different for the Preps, we got 3 Preps in one lane with 2 Year 6's and we were practically playing volleyball with each other. This for me, was the most fun activity from the day. We said goodbye to the preps and they went off to get their bags so they could get on the bus.

All the races were practically over by this point except for butterfly so we watched as the last race commenced. Once we had finished, Mr Martello announced the winners. In 4th place was Carmels, 3rd place was Joeys, 2nd place was

Hearts and 1st place, by just 5 points, was Saints.

Overall we'd like to thank Mr Hill, for organising the races and the whole swimming carnival. To the parent volunteers, we couldn't have done it without your help. To the teachers and Miss Mason, who organised all of the junior levels with their races, the sport captains for being in the pool practically all day helping with the younger kids. Finally, to everyone at Galilee, you all did such an amazing job on Friday, no matter if you got a ribbon or not. Thank you!


Year 6 High School Week

Bike Education

The Year 3/4 students will be participating in a Bike Education Program onsite with Mr Hill (a qualified bike instructor) on Monday 30th November and Monday 7th December.

We are hoping for better weather with the session cancelled last Monday due to torrential rain.

This program will be beneficial for the children as it will prepare them for future school camps which include bike riding activities.

They will learn about areas such as checking bicycles and helmets, correct riding techniques, basic bike skills, traffic signals and road rules.

Prep-2 PMP

The Prep-2 students began the Perceptual Motor Program (PMP) on Monday and will continue for the next two weeks. PMP is a movement-based program which helps younger students improve their eye/hand and eye/foot coordination, fitness, balance, locomotion and eye-tracking skills.

COVID Drop Off & Dismissal Process and Protocols

Drop Off/Dismissal

Morning Drop Off

• 8:35am Siblings (family groups) arrive

Prep siblings are to enter via Learning St gate and go straight to their classroom Years 1-6 siblings enter via the main gate and go straight to their class.

- 8:40am 8:50am All non-siblings arrive. Preps enter via Learning St gate and go straight to their classroom Year 1-6 enter via the main gate and line up on the basketball court with their teacher
- No parents/visitors will be allowed on the school grounds.
- Parents are asked not to gather in groups outside the school gates and to observe social distancing.

Afternoon Dismissal

- 3:00pm all siblings from all year levels (including those in the same year level, ie: twins, triplets) are dismissed.
- 3:10pm Prep and Year 1 students are dismissed.
- 3:15pm Year 2 and Year 3 students are dismissed.
- 3:20pm Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 students are dismissed.
- Parents are asked not to gather in groups outside the school gates and to observe social distancing. No dogs to be in school grounds.

Parents/Guardians are asked to please follow the directions of staff for dismissal:

- **1.** Parent/Guardian will enter the school grounds through the school gate when directed by a staff member.
- 2. Parent/Guardian will maintain social distancing along the brick pathway.
- **3.** When Parent/Guardian get to the front of the line on the brick pathway, they will collect child/ren.
- 4. Parent/Guardian and child/ren will exit through the big gate.

Late comers

- If your child is not at school by 8:50am and therefore will be late, there will be no admittance to the school grounds until 11:45am. This is due to the unavailability of staff to supervise late arrivals.
- We ask that you only use the Bank Street Entrance and you ring the doorbell once when you arrive.
- A staff member will meet you at the school gate and students will be escorted to the office.

Early pickups

- We strongly advise against students leaving school early.
- We ask that if at all possible you schedule medical appointments outside school hours; however, if this is unavoidable you must pick up your children at the following times: 11:45am or 1:40pm.
- We ask that only use the Bank Street Entrance and you ring the doorbell once when you arrive.
- A staff member will meet you at the school gate with the student.

Student On-Site Protocols

 COVID-19 symptoms upon arrival: Students presenting any COVID-19 symptoms including fever, cough, sneezing, temperature, runny nose will not be cleared for entry

- Masks: As per CEM directives, students will not be required to wear a mask, however, families may choose for their child to wear one.
- Arrival: Parents are to arrive at school with their child and remain with their child until they have been cleared to enter the premises.
- Social distancing: Parents, students and families <u>must not congregate</u> at the school gate before or after school. They must maintain 1.5 metres distance from other people when waiting for the school to open or close.
- COVID-19 symptoms throughout the day: Students who develop any COVID-19
 symptoms including fever, cough, sneezing, temperature, runny nose throughout the
 day will be immediately isolated with visual supervision. Parents will be contacted to
 collect their child immediately.
- Playground/shared equipment: As per CEM directives, students may use the playground and shared classroom equipment.
- Washing hands: Students are to wash hands thoroughly with soap, for 20 seconds, after sneezing, coughing, going to the bathroom and before and after eating.
- Drinking Taps: Students may not use the drinking taps and must have a drink bottle at school
- Physical Distancing: Students should practice physical distancing where possible.
 Maintaining a physical distance of 1.5 meters will not always be practical in the school environment and this may be particularly challenging in the younger years of primary school.

Annabelle, Luke, Jacob, and


some other children
