Transition of New Uniform

Please see below correspondence distributed to the school community in 2020 and earlier.

2020 Annual Report

In 2020, my role as Principal was full of rewards and challenges. Normal school life was interrupted by COVID-19. The dedicated staff at Galilee, myself included, found ourselves managing and navigating a new landscape in education. We were faced with the first pandemic in living memory, the ever-changing government directives, the first Melbourne extended school closure and a community who had been physically separated dealing with the challenges of home-schooling, job security and strict lockdown restrictions. Throughout the very turbulent 2020 school year, student learning and wellbeing remained our top priority. I am extremely proud of the care, professionalism and flexibility all staff showed towards our students and school community throughout 2020.

I worked in collaboration with the individual leaders in all areas, encompassing all aspects of home-schooling; including the needs of different students, staff members, families and year levels. I managed this by ensuring that our team at Galilee were kept up to date with information through daily Google Hangouts and that our support staff were in regular contact with students and families who needed extra support during this time. Just like all staff members at Galilee, I had to pivot in my role as Principal in 2020, managing the legalities of onsite operations, keeping abreast of government and education system directives, organising onsite student and staff limitations. communicating our community and keeping them up to date with the latest information, whilst being ever mindful of the wellbeing of my staff as they embraced and adapted to each challenge. We sought many ways to support and communicate with each other and our connections remained positive and supportive.

Thank you to both Deputies, Carlo Martello and Danielle Gerecke for their support and leadership throughout 2020 and to Wendy and Tegan who were vital links between staff and families. Thank you to the School Education Board for their tremendous support led by Darren Catherall as Chair and Athena Romic as Secretary. Their hard work, flexibility, expertise and support was greatly appreciated.

Thank you to the efforts of the Galilee Parents Association, led by Anastasia Kritikos and the Parent Reps who planned many events that could not proceed.

I would like to acknowledge and thank our Parish Priests, Father Hugh Brown and Father John Spiteri, for their ongoing support and for assisting with the changes that were made as the change of governance moved towards the Melbourne Archdiocese of Catholic Schools.

For all its challenges, 2020 was a year where we embraced changes and developed our capacity to be resilient and flexible.

Our thoughts and prayers are with those who suffered adversity throughout 2020.

Wellbeing

How can I support my child during lockdown?



Talk with them about what's going on, keeping communication as open as you can. Let them know that it's okay to feel however they feel – whether that's scared, worried, angry, sad or something else. You can find our tips on starting a conversation with your child here.

Try to answer your child's questions and reassure them in an age-appropriate manner.
While you don't need to know all the answers, talking things

through can help them feel calmer.

Encourage your child to do
the things that help them
when they're finding things
difficult. This will be different
for everyone – it could include
things like doing exercise or
going for a walk, watching a
favourite film, reading a
favourite book, cooking or
baking, talking to friends, or
drawing or writing.

Reassure them this will pass, you're there for them, and you will get through this together. Having returned to some of their normal activities over the summer, going back into stricter measures might feel frustrating for your child. They may even be worried that things will never get better. Recognise how difficult this is, while also letting them know that the pandemic will not last

Spend time doing a positive activity together. This can help them to feel calmer by giving them a short break from everything that's going on. It's also a great way of providing a space for them to talk through their concerns, without having

a 'big chat'. You can have a look at our <u>activity ideas</u> for younger children, and for <u>teenagers</u>, to help you.


Keep as many regular routines going as possible to help your child feel safe and secure. This can include things like having regular times for going to bed, waking up, eating meals and doing hobbies.

Drop Off/Dismissal

Drop off and Pick - Ups Times

Mornings:

The Bank Street Gate (Park Street will not be available) will open at 8.35am and all students will go directly to their classrooms.

We respectfully request that parents remain outside the school grounds in the mornings. This is due to current COVID -19 protocols, where any adult onsite for more than 15 mins must sign in for contact tracing purposes.

If you need to speak to someone, we encourage you to call the office so we can arrange an appointment time or email/Dojo you child's teacher.

Afternoons:

Please be reminded of our current times that students are to be **picked up at the end of the school day**.

- All students 3.15pm 3.20pm
- All other students riding or walking independently 3.25pm

It is impossible for school staff to monitor this, so we are totally reliant on our parent's cooperation.

Our reasons for the staggered times are

- to assist with parking turnover
- to be compliant with COVID-19 restrictions that aim to reduce the congregation of adults around the school and reduce congestion
- to ensure all our parents and students can leave the school safely

Galilee Wet Weather Student Collection

In the event of wet weather at the end of a school day, the following procedures will be used to ensure a safe collection of students:

- Parents/Carers to collect students from their classrooms from 3:15-3:25pm
- All Parents/Carers to enter via the school office door
- All Parents/Carers to exit via the nearest side/external stairwell after collecting child/ren
- Parents/Carers with prams or limited mobility can request the office to ring for their child/ren
- Children attending GOSH, walking or riding home by themselves will be dismissed from their classroom at 3:25pm

Year Two information:

- Parents/Carers from 2R to exit via classroom external door
- Parents/Carers from 2E to enter and exit via the same door to the Library
- Parents/Carers from 2J to exit via the new external door

Additional information:

- Staff members will be supervising those entering the building and exiting via the front gate and in the corridors
- Parents/Carers are expected to move safely and efficiently, walking throughout the school
- Parents/Carers are only allowed on site for up to 15 minutes (COVID-19 restrictions)
 so collection is not an opportunity to converse with teachers, staff or other parents
- In the event of a wet weather collection, parents/carers will be notified when possible via DOJO by 3pm (unless it rains after 3pm)
- Specialist teachers will return children to their classrooms at 3:10pm prior to collection
- Please see below a map of the school for collection of children

We thank everyone for their flexibility and cooperation in ensuring that pick-up is safe and efficient for all in dealing with COVID-19 restrictions.

Student On-Site Protocols

- COVID-19 symptoms upon arrival: Students presenting any COVID-19 symptoms including fever, cough, sneezing, temperature, runny nose will not be cleared for entry
- Masks: As per CEM directives, students will not be required to wear a mask, however, families may choose for their child to wear one.
- Social distancing: Parents, students and families <u>must not congregate</u> at the school gate before or after school. They must maintain 1.5 metres distance from other people when waiting for the school to open or close.
- COVID-19 symptoms throughout the day: Students who develop any COVID-19 symptoms including fever, cough, sneezing, temperature, runny nose throughout the day will be immediately isolated with visual supervision. Parents will be contacted to collect their child immediately.
- Playground/shared equipment: As per CEM directives, students may use the playground and shared classroom equipment.
- Washing hands: Students are to wash hands thoroughly with soap, for 20 seconds, after sneezing, coughing, going to the bathroom and before and after eating.
