#### Dear Families,

We would like to take this opportunity to thank you for all your support, patience and understanding during these past couple of weeks of remote learning. Remote Learning has been a government directive that schools have been required to follow.

We are thrilled to announce that following advice from the Chief Health Officer, the Victorian Government and Melbourne Archdiocese of Catholic Schools (MACS), all staff and students will be returning to onsite learning at Galilee on Friday 11th June.

Please note that the School Closure Day for Tuesday June 15 has been re-scheduled to Monday July 12 (first day of Term Three).

Many in our community have different vastly had experiences. For some, it has been an opportunity to spend time as a family while others have struggled combining parenting/teaching and working. Within set guidelines, Galilee has endeavoured to support families through onsite supervision (all permitted workers not working from home and vulnerable children) and Remote Learning.

We would also like to take this opportunity to thank dedicated staff at Galilee who worked around the clock to make sure the Remote Learning Program and onsite supervision that we offered our students allowed them to remain connected as as possible to their peers and learning.

#### **Returning School Devices**

If you borrowed a device from the school, students will need to return them with the charger to the office Friday morning.

# Morning Drop-Off and Afternoon Pick-Up Procedures remain unchanged

#### **Morning Drop-Off Procedures**

- Students can enter the school grounds via the Bank Street Gate between 8.35am - 8.50am. Students will need to say goodbye at the gate and walk themselves to their classroom (Please note Open Morning has been cancelled on Friday 11th June).

### Afternoon Pickup Procedures

Parents/Caregivers will access the school grounds from 3.15pm via the double gates on Bank St. They will walk in a clockwise direction around the students, collecting their child/ren as they pass them. Families will continue walking in a clockwise direction until they exit the school grounds via the pedestrian gate on Bank St. Adults are encouraged to maintain a 1.5m distance from others during our Afternoon Pick-Up.

#### **Necessary Precautions**

- To support and care for the health and wellbeing of all students and staff, the school will continue our enhanced cleaning routine.
- We ask that you talk to your children about the importance of good personal hygiene, frequent handwashing, as well as coughing into elbows and social distancing where possible.
- If your child is ill, feeling unwell or has a fever,
   they must not attend school. They must remain home and seek medical advice if necessary.

- If your child presents with a fever, cough, sore throat, runny nose, sneezing, shortness of breath or breathing difficulties, they must not attend school. They must remain home and seek medical advice if necessary.
- If a student presents with a cough, sore throat, sneezing, runny nose, fever, shortness of breath or breathing difficulties during school hours, parents will be called to pick up their children immediately. The sick bay will not be available.
- Please ensure yours and your emergency contact details are updated on Operoo.

## Student Reports and Student Led Conferences

Galilee's Student Reports will be available on Thursday 24th June via the Parent Portal.

Student Galilee's Led Conference will take place during the second week of Term 3, on Monday 19th July 2-7pm and Wednesday 21st July 2-5pm. Communication regarding signing up for a time meeting with child/ren's Classroom Teacher will be emailed to all families next week.

Galilee's Student Reports are in line with the reporting standards of Catholic schools the Archdiocese in Melbourne. Your child's report will be made accessible electronically, via a Parent Portal, for you to read and discuss with your child.

You will notice that the structure and style of the Reports has returned to a pre-COVID format with a greater emphasis on providing detailed checklists indicating student achievement across the Victorian Curriculum and

Religious Education Framework.

All Victorian schools are mandated to fully implement The Victorian Curriculum and the Religious Education Framework with the following expectations:

- · The standard curriculum frameworks approved for use by Victorian Catholic schools are the Victorian Curriculum F–10, the Religious Education Framework and the EAL (English as an Additional Language) Developmental Continuum P–10.
- · Where achievement is displayed graphically, it must be accompanied by a scale.
- · Judgements must be displayed in a way that convey progress since the last time the standard(s) were reported against in the school.
- · The scale must be an agelevel-expected scale.
- · Achievement must be displayed using a five-point scale and will show growth since the last Report.

Your child's achievement
against the Victorian
Curriculum and the Religious
Education Framework for the
semester is rated against a five

point descriptor scale, displayed by a **Dot**, which identifies whether your child is:

- Well above the standard:Well above the standardexpected at this time of year
- · **Above the standard:** Above the standard expected at this time of year
- At the standard: At the standard expected at this time of year
- **Below the standard:** Below the standard expected at this time of year
- Well below standard: Well below the standard expected at this time of year

Not all dimensions of a Learning Area are reported on each semester. If a child is showing the same result as the end of Semester Two 2020. this does not mean that progress has not occurred. Progress is not always even and each child has his/her own rate of learning. Each increment represents six month's growth and your child may still be progressing but consolidating what has been learnt previously, (your child may have shown five month's growth but not moved up an increment).

The Student Report format will contain a personalised General Comment about the student's personal and interpersonal skills, thinking skills, organisational skills as well as **Behaviour and Effort for all Learning Areas**.

In the Student Report, the Achievement Standards, from the curriculum, are presented in a table. Each student will be marked on the Achievement Standards, from the curriculum against a five-point scale. The table will indicate the student's level of mastery of each Achievement Standard with a tick against the scale heading that best represents their level of achievement.

The Report will provide you with an overview of your child's achievements and assist in strengthening our familyschool partnership. The Report is intended to promote discussion about how we can work together to benefit your child. If you have questions, please discuss them at the upcoming Student-Led Conferences that will occur in the second week of Term 3. An Operoo note will be sent home

with access to the Report, providing you with an opportunity to communicate questions you would like to discuss at the conferences.

# Drop Off & Dismissal Process and Protocols

#### **Drop Off/Dismissal**

#### **Drop off and Pick - Ups Times**

#### Mornings:

The Bank Street Gate (Park Street will not be available) will open at 8.35am and all students will go directly to their classrooms.

 $We \ respectfully \ request \ that \ parents \ remain \ outside \ the \ school \ grounds \ in \ the \ mornings.$ 

This is due to current COVID -19 protocols, where any adult onsite for more than 15 mins must sign in for contact tracing purposes.

If you need to speak to someone, we encourage you to call the office so we can arrange an appointment time or email/Dojo you child's teacher.

#### Afternoons:

Please be reminded of our current times that students are to be **picked up at the end of the school day**.

- All students 3.15pm 3.20pm
- All other students riding or walking independently 3.25pm

It is impossible for school staff to monitor this, so we are totally reliant on our parent's cooperation.

Our reasons for the staggered times are

- to assist with parking turnover
- to be compliant with COVID-19 restrictions that aim to reduce the congregation of adults around the school and reduce congestion
- to ensure all our parents and students can leave the school safely

#### **Galilee Wet Weather Student Collection**

In the event of wet weather at the end of a school day, the following procedures will be used to ensure a safe collection of students:

- Parents/Carers to collect students from their classrooms from 3:15-3:25pm
- All Parents/Carers to enter via the school office door
- All Parents/Carers to exit via the nearest side/external stairwell after collecting child/ren
- Parents/Carers with prams or limited mobility can request the office to ring for their child/ren
- Children attending GOSH, walking or riding home by themselves will be dismissed from their classroom at 3:25pm

#### Year Two information:

- Parents/Carers from 2R to exit via classroom external door
- Parents/Carers from 2E to enter and exit via the same door to the Library
- Parents/Carers from 2J to exit via the new external door

#### Additional information:

- Staff members will be supervising those entering the building and exiting via the front gate and in the corridors
- Parents/Carers are expected to move safely and efficiently, walking throughout the school
- Parents/Carers are only allowed on site for up to 15 minutes (COVID-19 restrictions)
   so collection is not an opportunity to converse with teachers, staff or other parents
- In the event of a wet weather collection, parents/carers will be notified when possible via DOJO by 3pm (unless it rains after 3pm)
- Specialist teachers will return children to their classrooms at 3:10pm prior to collection
- Please see below a map of the school for collection of children

We thank everyone for their flexibility and cooperation in ensuring that pick-up is safe and efficient for all in dealing with COVID-19 restrictions.

#### **Student On-Site Protocols**

- COVID-19 symptoms upon arrival: Students presenting any COVID-19 symptoms including fever, cough, sneezing, temperature, runny nose will not be cleared for entry
- Masks: As per CEM directives, students will not be required to wear a mask, however, families may choose for their child to wear one.
- Social distancing: Parents, students and families <u>must not congregate</u> at the school gate before or after school. They must maintain 1.5 metres distance from other people when waiting for the school to open or close.
- COVID-19 symptoms throughout the day: Students who develop any COVID-19 symptoms including fever, cough, sneezing, temperature, runny nose throughout the day will be immediately isolated with visual supervision. Parents will be contacted to collect their child immediately.
- Playground/shared equipment: As per CEM directives, students may use the playground and shared classroom equipment.
- Washing hands: Students are to wash hands thoroughly with soap, for 20 seconds, after sneezing, coughing, going to the bathroom and before and after eating.
