Transition of New Uniform

Please see below correspondence distributed to the school community in 2020 and earlier.

To avoid a uniform change in the middle of a season, the timeline for students from Prep-Year 5 will be the beginning of Term Two, 2022 (change from Summer to Winter uniform). This mandatory change will not be for Year 6 in 2022.

A reminder that:

- the woollen jumper,

- during the transition
 period, blending of the
 current and new
 uniform IS allowed as we
 are keeping the same
 colour scheme,
- modifications were made after consultation with the community over the last two-three years,
- we will continue to assist families financially with uniforms who are experiencing difficulty,
- used uniforms (current design) will be distributed to overseas schools in need by PSW.

Dear Families,

This Wednesday we again welcomed back all of the students to onsite learning. I acknowledge the many challenges in educating your child from home, while still working. The lockdown experiences have been very different for families but I believe that we have worked collaboratively together ensure the needs of the students, staff and parents are met. I am hoping that students will remain onsite for their learning throughout the remainder of the year.

The staff have really enjoyed spending time with the students; they are the reason we are drawn to the profession of teaching.

Students have appeared happy and excited to see their friends and to learn at school. For the some, changing environments might cause distress and this is okay. If your child is experiencing distress, you are encouraged communicate openly and to seek advice if it persists.

Children have inquiring minds and often ask interesting questions. This afternoon I was in 4R and they asked me dozens of questions about the progress of the building project and what will happen next year:

- Does it have an elevator?
- What will be built next?
- How will the buildings be joined?
- Where will our classes be located?

Is the project on time?

Jesai L from 1J made an appointment to show me his many drawings of what he would like in the new building design. In the photo below he is showing a large number of new video cameras complement our current ones. He also suggested chutes to distribute lunch orders and an elevator. Jesai's ideas are very clever and show a deep level of thinking. The students are showing great excitement over the new facility.



I was away on Long Service Leave for the first two weeks of this term. One of the things I was greatly excited about, were the changes to the Kitchen Garden. We are envisaging a kitchen garden that enables outside learning for the students, particularly in STEM. It is worthwhile viewing from Part St. Congratulations to Paul, Charlie and the students on their marvellous creation.

Parent Helper Course

Today we held our first of two Parent Helpers' Workshops for parents who are new to helping in the classroom at Galilee. The second and last workshop will be held tomorrow, Friday 30th July at 9.30am. The link to the workshop is on the Parent Calendar. You will be required to attend one of the workshops, if you have not attended a Parent Helper course in the past and if you are interested in assisting in the classroom this year.

You will need а current Working With Children's Check and an availability to assist at a set time once a week. For example, everv Tuesday morning. This will help teachers with forming a roster and knowing who will be helping on particular days. A committed time once a week is usually preferable as it allows both the teacher and the Parent Helper to develop a professional relationship

support all the students in the class. It also allows the Parent Helper to develop skills by working at regular times and thus knowing the routines and expectations of the class. If you are only able to help in the classroom occasionally, this is fine too.

If you have attended the Parent Helper Course in previous years, hold a current Working with Children's Check and are interested in helping in the classrooms again this year, we will be seeking your availability when COVID 19 restrictions ease.

We continue to value all the support and assistance from Parent Helpers and thank you in anticipation.

Building Project Update

As students returned to school this week, a welcome sight for everyone is seeing the new 3-storey Games Hall really starting to take shape.

Installation of the precast panels has progressed very well over the past few of weeks, including panels with impressive arched openings on

the new façade facing Bank
Street. Towards the rear of the
building, for those that look
closely you can even see a
small opening near the top of
precast wall against the
existing school building which
will ultimately connect the new
building to our existing
facilities.

Once the last few precast panels get installed, focus then will be on installation of the structural steel and construction of the bondeck floor slabs on level 1 and level 2. Works will then progress with the secondary structural steel on the top floor that will form the learning spaces. To follow on will be installation of the roof which will eventually allow the contractor to remove the large temporary props below.

It's an exciting phase of the project with plenty more to look forward to in the coming weeks.

Feeling Safe Together

This term at Galilee, each class was scheduled to complete workshops delivered by SECASA (South Eastern Centre Against Sexual Assault and Family Violence), aimed at raising children's awareness of personal safety and safe relationships. These workshops, entitled Feeling Safe Together, have been informed by local and international research into protective behaviour education programs.

Some of the topics covered in the workshops include:

- Rights, Responsibilities and Privileges
- Feeling/Emotions/Expres sions
- Early Warning Signs
- Gut Feeling in situations/around people
- Online Safety
- Safety Network of trusted grownups

As part of our commitment to a whole school approach, separate teacher and parent sessions were also to be made

available. Unfortunately, due to the current COVID-19 restrictions in place, we have had to postpone the program for now. We will keep you informed about new dates and will send out the Parent information prior to beginning workshops with the children.



Drop Off & Dismissal Process and Protocols

Drop Off/Dismissal

Drop off and Pick - Ups Times

Mornings:

The Bank Street Gate (Park Street will not be available) will open at 8.35am and all students will go directly to their classrooms.

We respectfully request that parents remain outside the school grounds in the mornings.

This is due to current COVID -19 protocols, where any adult onsite for more than 15 mins

must sign in for contact tracing purposes.

If you need to speak to someone, we encourage you to call the office so we can arrange an appointment time or email/Dojo you child's teacher.

Afternoons:

Please be reminded of our current times that students are to be **picked up at the end of the school day**.

- All students 3.15pm 3.20pm
- All other students riding or walking independently 3.25pm

It is impossible for school staff to monitor this, so we are totally reliant on our parent's cooperation.

Our reasons for the staggered times are

- to assist with parking turnover
- to be compliant with COVID-19 restrictions that aim to reduce the congregation of adults around the school and reduce congestion
- to ensure all our parents and students can leave the school safely

Galilee Wet Weather Student Collection

In the event of wet weather at the end of a school day, the following procedures will be used to ensure a safe collection of students:

- Parents/Carers to collect students from their classrooms from 3:15-3:25pm
- All Parents/Carers to enter via the school office door
- All Parents/Carers to exit via the nearest side/external stairwell after collecting child/ren
- Parents/Carers with prams or limited mobility can request the office to ring for their child/ren
- Children attending GOSH, walking or riding home by themselves will be dismissed from their classroom at 3:25pm

Year Two information:

- Parents/Carers from 2R to exit via classroom external door
- Parents/Carers from 2E to enter and exit via the same door to the Library
- Parents/Carers from 2J to exit via the new external door

Additional information:

- Staff members will be supervising those entering the building and exiting via the front gate and in the corridors
- Parents/Carers are expected to move safely and efficiently, walking throughout the school
- Parents/Carers are only allowed on site for up to 15 minutes (COVID-19 restrictions)
 so collection is not an opportunity to converse with teachers, staff or other parents
- In the event of a wet weather collection, parents/carers will be notified when possible via DOJO by 3pm (unless it rains after 3pm)
- Specialist teachers will return children to their classrooms at 3:10pm prior to collection

We thank everyone for their flexibility and cooperation in ensuring that pick-up is safe and efficient for all in dealing with COVID-19 restrictions.

Student On-Site Protocols

- COVID-19 symptoms upon arrival: Students presenting any COVID-19 symptoms including fever, cough, sneezing, temperature, runny nose will not be cleared for entry
- Masks: As per CEM directives, students will not be required to wear a mask, however, families may choose for their child to wear one.
- Social distancing: Parents, students and families <u>must not congregate</u> at the school gate before or after school. They must maintain 1.5 metres distance from other people when waiting for the school to open or close.
- COVID-19 symptoms throughout the day: Students who develop any COVID-19 symptoms including fever, cough, sneezing, temperature, runny nose throughout the day will be immediately isolated with visual supervision. Parents will be contacted to collect their child immediately.
- Playground/shared equipment: As per CEM directives, students may use the playground and shared classroom equipment.
- Washing hands: Students are to wash hands thoroughly with soap, for 20 seconds, after sneezing, coughing, going to the bathroom and before and after eating.
