Transition of New Uniform

Please see below correspondence distributed to the school community in 2020 and earlier.

To avoid a uniform change in the middle of a season, the timeline for students from Prep-Year 5 will be the beginning of Term Two, 2022 (change from Summer to Winter uniform). This mandatory change will not be for Year 6 in 2022.

- used uniforms (current design) will be distributed to overseas schools in need by PSW.



Dear Families,

In anticipation of the extended lockdown, we have been reviewing our remote learning model throughout this week.

Each lockdown has been

communicated at short notice and we are conscious of having a model that more closely replicates the daily routines of when students are at school. Starting on Monday 16th
August, the Remote Learning
Program at Galilee is going to
change.

For Galilee's new Remote Learning Program, every

student will need access to a device. **Devices** will available for collection at the front office on Friday 13th August from 11am and 2 pm and on Monday 16th August between 9am and 2pm. If you need to make a time outside of this window to collect a device, please ring the front office so that it can be arranged. Student Resource Packs are also available for collection at the above times.



The change to Galilee's Remote Learning Program is based on a need to:

- Increase the 'face-toface' teaching time that students are receiving during remote learning.
- Increase student access to teachers during remote learning.
- Focus more on the core subjects of Reading, Writing and Mathematics.

- Ensure continuity between onsite learning and remote learning programs.
- Establish a model that can be used at short notice for any potential future lockdowns.
- Ensure students are receiving a program where teachers support student learning in real time.

From Monday 16th August, classroom teachers at Galilee will:

- Facilitate daily Morning Google Meets with their students (prayer, roll, go over daily schedule and expectations).
- Explicitly teach students as a whole class and in small focus groups each day in Reading, Writing and Mathematics. There is flexibility with how the teacher structures their lesson and focus groups, as it depends on the content being taught, the learning needs of the students and the year level of the students. Our classroom teachers make

- their own professional judgements with this.
- Be available in a Google
 Meet for student
 support/questions
 between 9am 12:50pm
 (except if teaching a
 focus group or during
 break times).
- Additional staff will be working online with each year level, supporting children in Reading, Writing and Maths.
- All Specialist teachers and Education Support will be *fully utilised* for online and onsite support.
- On Friday, the structure of the day will be different from the structure from Monday - Thursday:
- 1. Classroom Teachers will run a Friday Morning Google Meet and then students will independently complete Specialist Tasks for the day.
- 2. Specialist Teachers will provide instructional videos and lessons for P 6 and be available via email to answer any questions on a Friday.

- Students will need to complete and submit (via email) Specialist Tasks by Sunday at 6pm.
- Classroom teachers will providing be more live/verbal feedback during extensive their online sessions. Reduced written feedback will be required as a result of greater face-to-face time.pt if teaching a focus group or during break times).

We know that this model of Remote Learning will give students at Galilee greater access to their teacher and increased opportunities learn the core subjects of Reading. Writing and Mathematics. We anticipate that there may be some issues around adjusting to this new structure and thank you for your patience as we navigate this new way of operating. We look forward to seeing all students in all year levels at the 9.00am Google Meet on Monday 16th August.

I would like to acknowledge the hard work, flexibility and dedication of the Galilee Staff who have worked tirelessly this week to produce a revised model in the best interests of our students.

We wish you and your families every blessing as we enter into a further seven days of Lockdown. We look forward to seeing the whole community on Friday 20th August when we are all hopefully able to return back to school.

Drop Off & Dismissal Process and Protocols

Drop Off/Dismissal

Drop off and Pick -Ups Times

Mornings:

The Bank Street Gate (Park Street will not be available) will open at 8.35am and all students will go directly to their classrooms.

We respectfully request that parents remain outside the school grounds in the mornings. This is due to current COVID -19 protocols, where any adult onsite for more than 15 mins must sign in for contact tracing purposes.

If you need to speak to someone, we encourage you to call the office so we can arrange an appointment time or email/Dojo you child's teacher.

Afternoons:

Please be reminded of our current times that students are to be **picked up at the end of the school day**.

- All students 3.15pm 3.20pm
- All other students riding or walking independently 3.25pm

It is impossible for school staff to monitor this, so we are totally reliant on our parent's cooperation.

Our reasons for the staggered times are

- to assist with parking turnover
- to be compliant with COVID-19 restrictions that aim to reduce the congregation of adults around the school and reduce congestion
- to ensure all our parents and students can leave the school safely

Galilee Wet Weather Student Collection

In the event of wet weather at the end of a school day, the following procedures will be used to ensure a safe collection of students:

- Parents/Carers to collect students from their classrooms from 3:15-3:25pm
- All Parents/Carers to enter via the school office door
- All Parents/Carers to exit via the nearest side/external stairwell after collecting child/ren
- Parents/Carers with prams or limited mobility can request the office to ring for their child/ren
- Children attending GOSH, walking or riding home by themselves will be dismissed from their classroom at 3:25pm

Year Two information:

- Parents/Carers from 2R to exit via classroom external door
- Parents/Carers from 2E to enter and exit via the same door to the Library
- Parents/Carers from 2J to exit via the new external door

Additional information:

- Staff members will be supervising those entering the building and exiting via the front gate and in the corridors
- Parents/Carers are expected to move safely and efficiently, walking throughout the school
- Parents/Carers are only allowed on site for up to 15 minutes (COVID-19 restrictions)
 so collection is not an opportunity to converse with teachers, staff or other parents
- In the event of a wet weather collection, parents/carers will be notified when possible via DOJO by 3pm (unless it rains after 3pm)
- Specialist teachers will return children to their classrooms at 3:10pm prior to collection
- Please see below a map of the school for collection of children

We thank everyone for their flexibility and cooperation in ensuring that pick-up is safe and efficient for all in dealing with COVID-19 restrictions.

Student On-Site Protocols

- COVID-19 symptoms upon arrival: Students presenting any COVID-19 symptoms including fever, cough, sneezing, temperature, runny nose will not be cleared for entry
- Masks: As per CEM directives, students will not be required to wear a mask, however, families may choose for their child to wear one.
- Social distancing: Parents, students and families <u>must not congregate</u> at the school gate before or after school. They must maintain 1.5 metres distance from other people when waiting for the school to open or close.
- COVID-19 symptoms throughout the day: Students who develop any COVID-19 symptoms including fever, cough, sneezing, temperature, runny nose throughout the day will be immediately isolated with visual supervision. Parents will be contacted to collect their child immediately.
- Playground/shared equipment: As per CEM directives, students may use the playground and shared classroom equipment.
- Washing hands: Students are to wash hands thoroughly with soap, for 20 seconds, after sneezing, coughing, going to the bathroom and before and after eating.
